"The streetraisedme"

Shortsummary

Zoltán, 35 - alcoholic, drug and pornaddict, gambler

Zoltán arrivedatthe Bonus PastorFoundation'stherapeutichome in Hungary on 17 January 2023, completelybroken, desperateforhope and a way out.

He heardaboutusfromhisgodmother, who called him from Germanywhen Zoltán hit rock bottom and washaunted by the thought of suicide. But he knew he wanted to live and wanted more than anything to start a new life, so he asked for help.

He startedhistherapywithgreatenthusiasm, almost absorbingthenewthingsthatsurroundedhim. Itwas a profoundlymovingnewexperienceforhimto be surroundedbyrespect and love fromeveryoneattheTherapeutic Home. Uptonow, he had toliterallyfightforanyspecialattention, earningtherespect of thegangsbyfighting and abusivebehaviour.

During theninemonths of therapy, Zoltan has workedthroughhis life, goingthrougheach of thestages of therapy. He completedthestages ofbeing a newclient, a newmember, a regularmemberand an old member - withmanyresponsibilities.

During our exploratory interviews we used a number of tools, including genograms, monodrama, psychodramatoolsasthetherapyprogressed and theelements of familyformation. For Zoltán, the most difficult part of thetherapywasdealingwithhisrelationshipwithhisparents. He wasbornas a impoverishedfamilywherethefatherwas second,unwantedchild in an alcoholicwhooftenabusedthefamilyduringhisregulardrinking. Hismotherworkedlonghours, butas a woman of weaknerves, sheoftendefusedhertensionby beating Zoltan. No wonderthat Zoltan soonspent more timeonthestreets, mixing withbadcompany, thanathomeoratschool. Hismaternalgrandmotherloved Zoltan and hisbrotherdearly, and theyoftenwenttoherforrefuge, butsadlyshediedearly Zoltan became completely vulnerable to his unpredictable parents at the ageof 13.











Hisfatherdiedrelativelyyoungof anunexpecteddeathfrom a heartattack, and Zoltán had todealwiththeirtroubledrelationship and mournhimseparately.

He wrote a lettertohim, sayingeverything he wantedtosaytohim, so he could end hisrelationshipwithhim. Sorting out hisrelationshipwithhismotherwasmuch more difficult, itwasonlytowardsthe end of thetherapythat he wasabletoputthatrelationshipto rest and acceptthathismotherwasunpredictable and couldnot be trusted. Regularone-to-onesupportsessions, grouptherapyopportunities, feedback, morning and eveningmeetings, feeling circles and a number of individual caresheets all served to support Zoltan's recovery.

came in withseverephysical pain which limited his mobility, duringthechecktwospinalinjurieswhichforcedhimto upsitwasdiscoveredthat he had be hospitalisedduringtherapy. Alreadyatthe end thetherapy of a womanwhoalsowantedtogetrid of heralcoholism, which disrupted his recovery process. Zoltán fell in love and made a bad decision when, against the advice of the therapy staff, they moved in togetherafterthe end of therapy. The relationshiplastedonlytwoweeks, Zoltán leftit, butitwassodisturbingthat he slipped and turnedtoalcohol. He immediately called his counsellor, theytalked and he startedgoingtosupportgroups. Sincethen he has had a securejob, workingas a securityguardfor a company. He keeps in regularcontactwithformertherapygroupmembers and hiscounsellor.

Zoltán wantstofinishhisstudiesbecause he has onlycompleted 11 grades, butwith a littlesupport he has thepotential and abilitytobecome a goodexperientialsupportworker. Both hisadvisor and hisgodmothersupporthim in this. Nowit is upto Zoltan todecidehow he willshapehis life. Hisbiggestdream is to start a family, tohavethekind of loving and close-knitfamily he never had as a child. Whether he has thestaminatomakeithappen is a questionforthefuture.
